About our Reserve Program

Reserve Officers are professionally trained and duly sworn law enforcement personnel. Reserve Officers are comprised of individuals that want to contribute to the safety and well being of their community as well as those who desire to work in law enforcement before seeking full-time law enforcement careers. The Port Hueneeme Police Department has always considered the merits and accomplishments of their Reserve Officers for filling full-time positions before seeking outside applicants.

Qualifications and Requirements:

Completion of a P.O.S.T. certified academy. (P.O.S.T. is an acronym for the California Commission on Peace Officers Standards and Training).

- Recruits are required to possess the P.O.S.T. PC 832 credentials.
- Pass background requirements, which includes a thorough background, including a polygraph, psychological, and medical examination.
- Minimum 21 years old.
- Valid California driver's license and acceptable driving record.
- No criminal convictions.
- Ability to work nights, weekends, and holidays.
- The commitment to contribute a minimum of sixteen hours per month and attend monthly training meetings.

Where do you receive POST Academy training

The Ventura County Police and Sheriff's Reserve Officer Academy is a fully accredited P.O.S.T. Regional Modular Training Center where cadets receive in excess of 478 hours of law enforcement training.

This training includes the identical P.O.S.T Learning Domains required for the regular officer training centers, but is taught on a evening and weekend schedule to accommodate cadets who cannot attend a full-time academy.

The Police and Sheriff's Academy is conducted by the Oxnard Police Department and is affiliated with Ventura College. Students will receive college units for successfully completing the Academy.

The Academy is located at Camarillo Airport, Camarillo, California.
